
**Evensong (BCP)**: This is taken from the Book of Common Prayer, written in the year 1662.

Evensong services are held most Sundays at 6.30 pm, alternative services are also held on Sunday evenings on the first Sunday of the month which are detailed on our Alternative Worship page.



The Evensong service is made up of hymns, psalms, readings and a sermon and lasts about 45 minutes. The language used is old English but far from being old fashioned, you will find that the difference in the service, the way things are said and heard, can often

lead you into a deeper sense of God's presence. It's a quieter service which is seen as a "little gem" by many.

Occasionally we include Benediction during Evensong.

**Benediction**: This is a very old service. The name itself means blessing. At this service, we pray together and the priest takes the Blessed Sacrament (which is blessed in the communion service) and blesses the people.
